3. Common Service Centre (CSC):-

As of now 153 Fair Price Shops have been registered as Common Service Centres. From 153, 138 CSC IDs have been created, out of which 128 FPS are activated.

4. e-KYC Camps for PDS Beneficiaries

Special drives have been undertaken to cover beneficiaries who have not yet Completed e-KYC. As a result of these efforts, the state has achieved Significant progress in Aadhaar seeding and biometric authentication for e-KYC, moving closer to 100% Aadhaar seeding and 80% e-KYC Completion for NFSA. 61 e-KYC camps were conducted for the month of January, 2026.

5. Programme on National Consumer Rights Day

The Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Government of Goa, in collaboration with the Consumer Welfare Cell and Legal Aid Cell of V.M. Salgaocar College of Law, Miramar, organized a programme on 09/01/2026 to observe National Consumer Rights Day on the theme **“Efficient and Speedy Disposal through Digital Justice.”** The programme aimed to promote consumer awareness, ethical market practices, and highlight the role of technology in strengthening consumer justice delivery mechanisms. The event was graced by eminent dignitaries, including **Dr. Anant Sharma, National Chairman, Consumer Confederation of India,** and **Shri Jayant Tari, Director, Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Government of Goa.**

Dr. Anant Sharma underscored the significance of consumer education and collective responsibility in strengthening consumer protection mechanisms, particularly in the digital era. He stressed the need for efficient grievance redressal systems to ensure accessible and speedy justice for consumers.

Shri Jayant Tari, in his address, highlighted the evolution of consumer protection laws in India, emphasised the importance of digital grievance redressal mechanisms, and encouraged active stakeholder participation in initiatives such as the **National Consumer Helpline**. Expert sessions on digital justice by Miss. Rachna A.M. Gonsalves, Hon'ble Member, Goa State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission and Miss. Rejitha Rajan, Hon'ble Member, North Goa District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, along with prize distribution for consumer awareness competitions, marked the programme and reaffirmed a collective commitment to empowering consumers through accessible, transparent, and technology-driven redressal mechanisms.

The programme also aligned with the nationwide **Consumer Awareness Bharat Yatra** organised by the **Confederation of Consumer Organisations of India (CCI)**, the apex body of voluntary consumer organisations in the country, with the consent of the Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of India, on the occasion of its **Silver Jubilee Year**. The Yatra was flagged off from New Delhi on **24 December**, during the National Ceremony organised by the Ministry of Consumer

Affairs to mark **National Consumer Day**, and is scheduled to traverse all States before culminating in New Delhi on **15 March 2026**, coinciding with **World Consumer Rights Day**. As part of this initiative, the Yatra passed through the State of Goa from **08 January 2026 to 10 January 2026**, with the primary objective of educating and empowering consumers, promoting effective implementation of consumer protection laws, and ensuring widespread dissemination of information on consumer awareness programmes and welfare schemes undertaken by both the Central and State Governments.

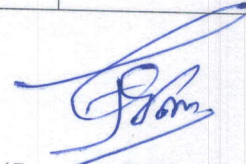

ACTIONS OF DEPARTMENT

The Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Government of Goa has implemented the decision of Government of India for free of cost foodgrain distribution under NFSA w.e.f. 1st January, 2023 to 31st December, 2023. Now, Government of India, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, New Delhi has taken a decision to provide free foodgrains to NFSA (AAY and PHH) beneficiaries for further period of five years w.e.f 1st January, 2024. The ration card holders and the beneficiaries in the State are allotted following quota during the month of **January, 2026** under National Food Security Act, 2013 to Antyodaya Anna Yojana and Priority Household (AAY and PHH) (Fortified Rice), Tide Over (APL) (Fortified Rice) (Regular), Tide Over Wheat and Welfare Institution Scheme (Fortified Rice) is as under:
